Below, you will find a list and reimbursement information regarding many of the common requests we receive at Kushner & Company. Obviously we cannot list every item, but this guide should provide you with some additional knowledge regarding what is and is not eligible for reimbursement under the Health Flexible Spending Accounts (FSAs) and Health Savings Accounts (HSAs). If you are enrolled in an HRA, this list may not be applicable. Please see your plan's Summary Plan Description (SPD) for more details. Remember too that reimbursable expenses are those Medical Care Expenses that are incurred "for the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease, or for the purpose of affecting any structure or function of the body." Expenses that are dual purpose must pass the "but for" test, which means that an expense would not have been incurred "but for" the medical condition causing its use.

Effective January 1, 2011, Over-the-Counter (OTC) drugs/medicines are only reimbursable with a prescription from your doctor.
